Prembhai - An Extra-Ordinary Missionary

I had met Prembhai for the first time in 2004, when Bishop Thomas Pulloppillil had invited me to preach a retreat to his priests in Bongaigaon. After the retreat he told me that I should visit Arunachal Pradesh. I was delighted. He had asked a priest of his to accompany me from Bongaigaon to Harumutti, spend the night in Harumutti, in Tezpur diocese and informed Prembhai at Banderdewa to take me round. As our vehicle passed through Arunachal Pradesh, Prembhai was saluted at every corner by the traffic police and others. He was treated almost like VVIP. This area of Arunachal Pradesh was a part of Tezpur diocese. There were no parishes or Christian missionaries in Arunachal Pradesh at that time.

At the time I visited Arunachal Pradesh situated in the remote North East of India and extending over snow-capped mountains in the North to the fertile plains of Brahmaputra valley in the South, his courage and audacious resourcefulness helped him to carry his mission deep into the territory. It is a world apart from any other state in India

Prembhai's name was Henry Gaikwad born on 15th January 1953 from devoted parents at Shrirampur a village in Maharashtra. His brothers and sisters were settled in Pune. He graduated in economics from Pune University.

In 1981 Miss Meera Carvalho from Bareilly Ashram in Uttar Pradesh was instrumental in his going to Arunachal Pradesh. When he visited Itanagar for the first time to preach a retreat with Swamy Deena Bandu, after obtaining inner permit, Swamy Deena Bandhu returned after the retreat to his Ashram in U.P and Prembhai's inner spirit kept him back to work for Arunachal. He was a very simple person with a great zeal for the Lord and His Gospel. He was a young lay man. He wore very simple clothes. He had a pair of sandals made up of truck tyre bought at the cost of rupees seven that lasted for fourteen years.

Catechist of Daporijo renamed him "Prem Bhai, the father of Arunachal" in 2002. His tours used to last six weeks and on his tours he used to dress with a Nyishi overcoat, a Narah - a bamboo bag at the back in which he used to carry a Bible, Everyday prayer and a Benedictine Cross.

He was arrested in Itanagar, Seppa and Kaying. The result of the

arrest was there were more believers in Jesus because of his life and behavior in the police station and in the jail.

In May 1982, after his brief vacation in Pune and Sachidananda Ashram Thanneerpalli in Trichy, Tamilnadu where he met Fr. Bede Griffith, a Benedictine, who founded an Indian style ashram, he returned to Harumutti.

Arunachalis donated him a hill to open an ashram; it was close to Banderdewa check gate. He built the ashram in style of Holy Trinity Ashram of Bede Griffith. He conducted many seminars, prayer meetings and healing sessions for the people of Arunachal Pradesh.

Prembhai was a man of faith and prayer. He lived in constant union with Him. His prayer was a prayer of an apostle for the mission, for the spread of the Gospel and for Christians. Sanctity and fruitfulness in apostolate are beautifully blended in Prembhai.

Prembhai was an ideal missionary who laboured tirelessly to accomplish the mission of Jesus. Amid the hard work and suffering he kept his balance. He knew how to be strict yet kind. He could live in abundance as well as in poverty.

Prembhai was a great builder of the Church, and had a high degree of organizational skill. He founded many and flourishing communities in Arunachal Pradesh.

He undertook a few pilgrimages taking people from this area to Shillong, Calcutta, Vailankani, Chennai, Bombay and Goa. He went beyond my way in evangelization.

On October 14, 2006 he received the habit of secular Oblate of Abbaye St. Joseph de Chairval, in the parish Church of Harumatti, Diocese of Tezpur in Assam.

On June 28, 2008 he died in his bed of a massive heart attack in Sri Lanka. His body reached Banderdewa Ashram, Arunachal Pradesh on July 02 and on July 03, Archbishop Thomas Menaparambil SDB conducted his funeral rites and was buried in the chapel he had built at Banderdewa Ashram. Thousands of people bid fare well to him.

He will remain the glory of lay apostolate in Indian Church especially in Arunachal Pradesh.

Palli Unnayan Samiti made aware the community about the MGNREGS- the 100 days job guarantee scheme to ensure earning to the poor and marginalized family and also development of village resources like watershed management, construction of mud road, repair river

embankment & mangrove plantation, land sapping, canal excavation to reduce disaster risk reduction. The project staff motivated 155 women and 74 men to have income opportunity under the scheme and they got an average 42 days job during the year.



Beautician Course to 90 Adolescents:



The workshop was conducted by the West Bengal Minorities Financial Development Corporation to explain the salient features of "Aikyashree", the scholarship workshop for minority students of the State recently introduced by our Honourable Chief Minister, Mamata Banerjee. The workshop was held at Sacred Heart Church, Parish Hall, Thakurpukur where all arrangements had been made under the watchful supervision of Father Himangshu Poti, the Parish Priest. The Hall was packed on this day with two hundred and fifty parents and children. The General Manager of WBMFDC, Md. Naqui, clearly explained the main features of this unique scholar-ship scheme introduced exclusively for the minority children of Bengal. In operating the Power Point presentation, he was ably assisted by Mr. Crispin Coelho of The Park English School. Md. Naqui lucidly showed the parents and

children how to access the scholarship site, how to fill the online application form, how to download a copy of the same and present it to the concerned School/College. The scholarship amounts, ranging from Rs. 1100 to Rs. 16200, for both Pre and Post Matric students, will be directly transferred into their Bank accounts. "Aikyashree" will certainly benefit all the eligible Christian students of our State.
