But this should not be so as the global medical report shows that only 6% patients have died whereas almost 94% patients have recovered. Therefore, we should keep safe distance from Corona virus in order to keep ourselves alive.

With the progress of the human civilization, the science and technology have also been developed. Medical science has taken an important role in our lives and it has been successful to prolong our life span although it could not succeed to prevent death. We see a new life is born while the older one dies. In spite of continuous efforts by the doctors and scientists we could not keep ourselves alive for ever. Hence, science has to accept the existence of God.

People in populated areas living along with their domestic animals with no proper sanitation facilities and poor nutrition are infected with various diseases. Sometimes the spread of the disease was so fast that it has turned to be a pandemic. It is not that this is the first time that the humanity is facing a pandemic. We can traceback to five deadliest pandemics in the history which destroyed millions of lives. 1) One of the deadliest pandemics was the **Plague of Justinian** in Constantinople, the capital of Byzantine Empire in 541 CE. It had spread across Europe, Asia, North Africa and Arabia killing an estimated 30 to 50 million people at the rate of as many as 5000 per day. At that time, nobody knew how to combat the disease and so tried to avoid the sick persons. 2) **The Black Death** which hit Europe in 1347 claiming an estimated 200 million lives in just four years. The infected persons used to suffer from blisters on the body.

During that pandemic forced isolation of quarantine was introduced in order to combat the spread of that disease. 3) The **Great Plague of London** had repeatedly appeared within a period of 300 years between the years 1348 to 1665 A.D. The outbreak of that plague in 1665 claimed nearly 100,000 lives within seven months only. All public entertainments were banned and victims were forcibly shut into their homes to prevent the spread of the disease. The symptoms of that plague were swellings in the armpits, groin and neck. The affected persons used to suffer from headache, vomiting and fever. 4) The **Smallpox**, an epidemic spread in Europe, Asia and Arabia for centuries killed three out of ten patients. It was reported that almost 10 million people died in Mexico in the 15th Century. 5) **Cholera** was a pandemic which initially originated in Bengal near Calcutta starting in 1817 and later on it spread from India to South East Asia, Middle East, Europe, Eastern Africa and North America. History records that the Cholera appeared as a pandemic for a number of times claiming millions

As per the advice of the Doctors, scientists, Governments and important persons of the society we are to observe few key measures to keep the virus away from us. 1) Maintaining **personal hygiene** is very important. We need to wash our hands as necessary, covering mouth and nose with mask, avoiding touching them with our hands etc. 2) Maintaining the social distance especially from those who speak louder, having cough or habit of sneezing. 3) Improvement of food habit balanced with protein, vitamins, minerals etc. along with sufficient water and fruit juice is necessary to keep ourselves healthy and boost our immunity system. We should be careful to keep ourselves free from other sicknesses because they weaken the immunity system. 4) Good sleep of 7 to 8 hours is absolutely necessary to keep ourselves healthy. 5) Bad habits like smoking, drinking etc. is to be avoided. 6) We should not be unnecessarily in **panic**. All worries are to be avoided. In case of sickness, we need to consult the physicians and get treated.7) It is advisable to keep some essential medicines like Paracetamol etc. in hand.

History is a strong witness of how humans have always overcome these desolate situations. This time too "we shall overcome" and come out victorious. "Divine Love always has met, and always will meet, every human need" (Mary Baker Eddy). Hence, after doing all, let us leave the rest in God's hands.

News from Palli Unnayan Samiti Baruipur

Emergency Relief Operation to the COVID-19 and Cyclone "AMPHAN" Affected Families in the District of South 24 Parganas



The 'Cyclone Amphan' ravaged the state of West Bengal on 20th May 2020, claiming 86 lives and affecting around 10 million people across 9 districts in the state. Palli Unnayan Samiti, Baruipur has swung into immediate action to address the humanitarian needs of the most vulnerable people in different villages; especially in the remote islands of Sundarban in the District of South 24 Parganas. Most of the distribution areas are located at an approximate distance of 90 Kms from Kolkata city; the coastal part of the district South 24 Parganas.

PUS Baruipur distributed relief materials as

emergency response to the 9980 most affected COVID-19 and cyclone AMPHAN families in the district of South 24 Parganas, West Bengal to meet their immediate lifesaving needs like food security, protective shelter Kits (tarpaulin, ground sheet, nylon rope, bucket, solar lamp etc), hygiene Kits (washing soap, bathing soap, chlorine tablet, face mask, sanitary pad etc) and dry food (rice, dal, biscuits, cooking oil, ata, potato, onion etc) with love and dignity. This relief operation program was executed as humanitarian response through a team of dedicated staff associated with local Volunteers and PRI with the support of CRS, Manos Unidas, Caritas India, FADV, JVS and Zomato India.



The beneficiary selection was done in close coordination with the Gram Panchayat to avoid duplication of beneficiaries, followed with physical verification by PUS field staff and volunteers. After the beneficiary selection, PUS Baruipur Relief Distribution Team conducted relief distribution.
