CATHOLIC BELIEF IN PURGATORY

The First day of Month of November is the Feast day of All Saints and the next day is the All Souls Day. Since the month of November begins in remembrance of our departed brothers and sisters, the whole month is dedicated to offer Holy Masses, prayers, fasting, sacrifices and rosaries for our departed dear and near ones who are being purified in the Purgatory.

What is the purgatory? Purgatory is a spiritual realm where souls go when they have not been condemned to hell, yet are still not cleansed of sin enough to enter heaven a realm in which spirits "endure severe punishment and in the process become cleansed of sin and its ill effects (Patheos)". It is understood that those souls are sent to the Purgatory escaped the pain and suffering of hell as purgatory is not a place where human beings spend for eternity. Popes John Paul II and Benedict XVI have declared that "Purgatory" is not a place, but a condition of existence. We cannot know what exactly is going on inside the purgatory but the general idea is that the souls are being spiritually cleansed and prepared for heaven. The Scriptures say "But nothing unclean will enter into heaven" (Rev. 21:27). Someone suggested that the purgatorial fire is expiatory and purifying, not punitive like hell fire.'

The Catholic Church supports the doctrine of Purgatory as after life purification as in 2 Mac 12:42-45. Protestants churches in general reject the Catholic doctrine of purgatory although some teach the existence of an intermediate state. Judaism teaches about Gehenna, a place of purification where according to some traditions, most sinners spend up to a year before their release. Islam has a similar concept to that of purgatory in Catholic doctrine of purgatory. They name it as Barzakh, a realm between paradise (Jannah) and hell (Jahannam). It is a place of those who go neither to hell nor to heaven. Indian religions believe in purification of the soul in Naraka.

The Catholic Church strongly believes that the prayers of Our Lady and the saints are great help for the souls in Purgatory. "Blessed Virgin Mary is not only the mother of physical Christ but she is also the mother of the Mystical Body of Christ" (Ave Maria Magazine, Vol 70, Oct 29, 1949, pg 551), i.e. Church. Therefore, she is the Mother of Christians on earth, in Heaven and in Purgatory.

"Mary is ever pleading for the Holy Souls in Purgatory and her intercession alone merits more than that of all the saints and angels taken together." The participation of Mary towards the redemption of the humanity at the foot of the Cross gives her the privilege to intercede for the souls in a special way. St. Augustine wrote, her mediation is universal, thus she has a special ability to help the souls in Purgatory. St. Brigid wrote that she heard Jesus say to His mother "You are My Mother, the Mother of Mercy and the consolation of the souls in Purgatory. St. Bernadine also wrote that souls are often visited and relieved by Mary. On St. Faustina's visit to the Purgatory with her Guardian Angel, she met the suffering souls in the fire of purgation, whose greatest torment was longing for God. They prayed fervently, but to no avail, for themselves; only we can come to their aid (Diary No. 20). She wrote, "Purgatory is a result of the justice of God, but Mary is there providing the souls with refreshment."

Since Mary our Blessed Mother is so caring for the souls suffering in Purgatory, we recommend our departed souls to her sincere prayers and intercessions. We need to recite the rosary for them. No day should pass without the recitation of the rosary. Mother Mary must be requested to take their souls under her special protection so that they too may be relieved of their sufferings. As this is the month of November let us remember our dear ones and offer for them prayers, Holy Masses, recite rosaries, fasting and doing penance and sacrifices for the souls of our departed dear ones. Therefore, we should never stop praying for the deceased because no prayer is ever wasted with God.

Number of Participants

The training on strengthening community vigilance committees (CVC) has been conducted on 12.10.2020. Altogether 35 CVC leaders from Biprodaspur, Pathankhali, Shambhunagar Kanthalbaria, Charabidya Chunakhali, Fulmalanch and Amjhara Gram Panchayet in Gosaba & Basanti Bolcks participated in this program. The aim of the training is to build up capacity of the community people to combat against the violence and abuse of women and children. The community should be aware against early marriage, School Dropout, Nutrition, Gender bias and human trafficking.

Topic Discussed:

- Concept of violence & abuse against women & children
- Child protection

- Trafficking and how it relate to safe & unsafe Migration
- Role of Community Vigilance committee
- Protection of violence & abuse
- · Adolescents health
- Linkage & rapport building with local Govenment

The information services and linkages facilities to CVCs could be as an agent or means of prevention and protect women and children from abuse and violence. Linkage meeting with different Government departments, like PRI, Health, Education, Legal Aids and dial help line. The field based meetings and trainings are also very much useful to strengthen both the CVCs and the community to access the benefits. These processes enable to reduce the evils against women and motivate the community to reduce discrimination.


