Homage to Late Bishop Linus Nirmal Gomes S.J. 07-09-1921 to 27-02-2021

September 07, 2021 is the birthday of Late Bishop Linus Nirmal Gomes SJ. Only 191 days were left for him to complete 100 years on this earth before he was called by the Lord to his Eternal Rest. Bishop Linus Nirmal Gomes S.J. was the first Bishop of Catholic Diocese of Baruipur. I would like to dedicate the editorial of Baruipur News Letter in remembrance of Bishop Linus Nirmal Gomes S.J.

I was probably in ninth standard when I saw Bishop in my village when he had come to confer the Sacrament of Confirmation. I was a boy of seventeen years and I had already received the Sacrament of Confirmation by Lawrence Cardinal T. Picachy SJ. I wanted to meet him and wanted to express my desire to be a priest. The moment of meeting him is still fresh in my mind. After letting him known that I want to be a priest I kept quiet, listening to him. He was only advising me to study hard, make good result without giving an indication that he will in future accept me as a candidate for his diocese.

Later on I came to his intimacy when I became one of the seminarians of his diocese. He was so fatherly and loving.

Bishop Linus Nirmal Gomes was born on 7th September 1921 in the village of Balidior in East Bengal (now Bangladesh). His village belongs to St. Francis Xavier's Parish at Golla. His Father's name was Mr. Domingo Gomes and his mother's name was Mrs. Anna Cecilia Gomes. He had four Brothers and four sisters. His father was the head Clark at the Holy Cross School in Bandura under Dacca District, run by the CSC Brothers from America. He was also the superintendent of St. Joseph's Hostel run by the same brothers. He was also the pupil of Bengali language to the Holy Cross Fathers and brothers. He was given primary education by the Sisters of Our Lady of the Mission (RNDM) at Thecla's Free Primary School in Golla. He also prepared by them for the sacraments of the 1st Holy Communion and the Confirmation.

He had his schooling from 1931 to 1939 at Holy Cross School, Bandura, Bangladesh. He completed his matriculation in 1940. After the Matric Examination he came to St. Xavier's College, Calcutta and he took admission at the I.S.C. department. After the Intermediate Arts Examination in 1942 he responded to the call of Christ and to the influence especially of Late Fr. P. Turmes S.J., join the Jesuit novitiate.

After his Ordination to the priesthood on November 21, 1954 at St. Mary's College, Curseong. He was sent to Gosaba, one of the substations of Basanti

Parish. He remained there for a month and visited the catholic families in Gosaba, Pakhirala, Sobnomoskar, Birajnagar and regularly offered the Holy Eucharist. After that he was appointed

as the Curate of St. Teresa's Church, Kolkata in 1957. He was appointed the 1st Headmaster of St. Peter's High School, at St. Teresa's Parish and continued in the post till December 1966. Fr. Linus then was appointed the Parish Priest of St. Teresa's Church, Kolkata in January 1967 until November 1977 when Pope Paul VI appointed him the First Bishop of Baruipur Diocese on August 18, 1977. His Episcopal Ordination was on Saturday, November 19, 1977 at St. Xavier's College, Calcutta. And on Sunday, 12th of March 1978 Rev. Fr. Leander D'Costa, Chancellor of the Archdiocese of Calcutta gave the canonical effect to the Apostolic letter giving a ceremony which took place at St. Stephen's the Martyr Church, Kalyanpur and started to reside at Bishop's House, Kulpi Road Salepur, Post Office Baruipur, Pin 743 302, 24 Parganas (Kolkata 700014, West Bengal).

There were lot of developments in the diocese during his reign. To place on record, three new parishes were erected namely Baruipur, Gosaba and Budge Budge; 11 new institutions like Palli unnayan Samiti, Bishop's House, Women's Welfare centre, convents (Holy Cross Convent, Baruipur, Bethany Convent, Thakurpukur Daughters of St. Anne, Gobrachawk), schools (K.E. Carmel School, Amtala, Holy Cross School), Juniorate (Dhyan Ashram), candidature (Thakurpukur IBVM), postulant (Keorapukur AC) etc.

Rt. Rev. Linus Nirmal Gomes S.J. submitted his resignation to the Holy Father due to ill health after leading the diocese as the good shepherd for 18 years. Holy Father accepted his resignation with effect from October 31, 1995.

After the retirement from Catholic Diocese of Baruipur he went to Bangladesh at Jesuit Residence in Monipuripara, Tajgaon, Dhaka for his mission work in 1997 and spent almost 18 years from July 1997 to December 2014. Thereafter, from 2014 he stated to reside at St. Xavier's College, Jesuit Community until he was called to his final aboard on the eve of February 27, 2021. It was a very audacious moment for me to preside over his funeral mass on Monday, 01 March 2021 in the Cathedral of Immaculate Heart of Mary and St. Teresa of Calcutta, Baruipur followed by rite of burial in the Bishop's house cemetery.

Emergency Humanitarian Response for COVID-19 and Cyclone "Yaas" affected people during the month of July and August 2021

PUS Baruipur distributed relief materials to 3339 families affected by COVID-19 and Cyclone "Yaas" as Humanitarian Response in the month of July and August 2021 in its project operational area. Local volunteers and PRI members extended their support as relief operation machinery has identified the beneficiaries and completed the relief distribution in time.



The beneficiaries families were very happy to receive Dry Ration Kits (Rice, Dal, Wheat flour, Sugar, Beaten rice, Cooking oil, Soyabean, Jaggery, Tea, Turmeric powder, Chili powder, Sattoo, Potato, Onion) Hygiene Kits (Mask, Sanitizer, Bathing Soap and Detergent Powder) as to meet their essential commodities in this crucial time of Post Cyclone and COVID -19 lockdown situation as most of them lost their Job. PUS Baruipur also distributed Tarpaulin, Ground Sheet and Rope as shelter kit to Cyclone Yaas affected families who lost their houses.

120 Hygiene kits (including one pulse oximeter, one digital thermometer, one respiratory steamer, 5 N 95 masks, one Savlon Hand wash and two Savlon hand sanitizers) received from Caritas India and will be distributed among ASHA and ICDS workers in PUS operational Area, so that they may use for their safety to protect from COVID -19. The inaugural occasion was concluded with thanks and gratitude to the Almighty God.
