#### **COMMUNION OF THE LIVING AND THE DEAD**

All Souls Day is a holy day set aside for honoring and praying for those who have gone to the Lord. According to Catholic belief, the soul of a person who dies can go to one of three places. The first is heaven, where a person who dies in a state of perfect grace and communion with God goes. The second is hell, where those who die in a state of mortal sin are naturally condemned by their choice. The intermediate option is purgatory, which is thought to be where most people, who are still in the need of purification must go, before they see the beatific vision. In his GENERAL AUDIENCE on Wednesday, August 4, 1999, Pope St. John Paul II said that human beings have definitive option for or against God.

The Church formulated its doctrine of faith on Purgatory at the Council of Florence and Trent. The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* defines purgatory as a "purification, so as to achieve the holiness necessary to enter the joy of heaven," which is experienced by those "who die in God's grace and friendship, but still imperfectly purified," (CCC 1030). It notes that this final purification of the elect is entirely different from the punishment of the damned. (cf. CCC 1031).

Purgatory is like a purifying fire burning inside a person, a painful experience of regret for one's sins, Pope Benedict XVI said. "A soul stained by sin cannot present itself to God," the pope said on January 12, 2011, at his weekly general audience. He spoke about the life and mystical writings of St. Catherine of Genoa, a 15th-century married woman who ran Genoa's largest hospital. She lived a worldly life. However, in the later stage of her life, when she became aware of the length, breadth, height and depth of God's love, the craving for union

pushed her to perform sacrifices and penances for purification. In order to have perfect communion with God of love the purgation already began on earth.

Many saints and holy persons have given witness to visits of men and women from Purgatory in want of prayer. An excerpt from the diary of St. Faustina Kowalska reveals, "One night, a sister who had died two months previously came to me. She was a sister of the first choir. I saw her in a terrible condition, all in flames with her face painfully distorted. This lasted only for a short time, and then she disappeared. A shudder went through my soul because I did not know whether she was suffering in PURGATORY or in hell. Nevertheless, I redoubled my prayers for her. The next night she came again, but I saw her in an even more horrible state, in the midst of flames which were even more intense, and despair was written all over her face. I was astonished to see her in a worse condition after the prayers I had offered for her, and I asked, "Haven't my prayers helped you?" She answered that my prayers had not helped her and that nothing would help her. I said to her, "And the prayers which the whole community has offered for you, have they not been any help to you?" She said no, that these prayers had helped some other souls. I replied, "If my prayers are not helping you, Sister, please stop coming to me." She disappeared at once. Despite this, I kept on praying. After some time she came back again to me during the night, but already her appearance had changed. There were no longer any flames, as there had been before, and her face was radiant, her eyes beaming with joy. She told me that I had a true love for my neighbor and that many other souls

had profited from my prayers. She urged me not to cease praying for the souls in PURGATORY, and she added that she herself would not remain there much longer. How astounding are the decrees of God!" (Diary, 58) On Sunday, November 2, 2003, on the occasion of the commemoration of All Souls, Pope John Paul II said, "The Church has always urged us to pray for the dead. She invites her believers to regard the mystery of death not as the last word on human fate but as a journey toward eternal life." Explaining a key element of the doctrine of Purgatory, the Pontiff said, "It is an important duty of ours to pray for the dead because although they may have died in grace and in friendship with God, they may still be in need of a last purification in order to enter into the joy of heaven." The Pontiff added, "Prayer for the souls of the dead can be expressed in various ways, including a visit to the cemetery. Going to these sacred places provides an auspicious occasion to reflect on the meaning of earthly life and to nourish, at the same time, hope in the blessed eternity of paradise".

The Catechism states that the "Eucharist is celebrated in communion with the whole Church in heaven and on earth, the living and the dead." The worthy reception of Holy Communion at Mass unites us to Jesus Christ, and by doing so, unites us to everyone who is in union with him. This includes all the saints in heaven, not only the "canonized" ones recognized by the Church, but also the deceased individuals who have been and are being purified by Christ's love. In this way we pray for them and they pray for us to strengthen the communion of the living and the dead.

They used the flipcharts on Adolescents Health and Hygiene and discussed about the physical & mental changes during the adolescent period. How to maintain Adolescent Health and Hygiene during Menstrual Cycle, Preparation Balance Diet from locally available low cost fruits and vegetables, Prevention of Malnutrition, Vitamin, Iron and other minerals deficiency disorder; specially the reason for anaemia due to Iron deficiency during adolescent period.

#### **Education Materials Distribution**

On 22<sup>nd</sup> October 2022, Palli Unnayan Samiti Baruipur distributed the educational materials among the 140 members from different Children Parliament at Halderpara, Majhipara under Charavidya, Battala, Midyapara and Amjhara Gram Panchayet under WCP Project.
