DEI VERBUM: WORD OF GOD

On the occasion of the Ordinary Jubilee, Marking the 2025 years of the Birth of Our Lord Jesus, we have a lot of preparations to undertake. The Holy Father wishes that the four Constitutions of the Second Vatican Council be studied by all the members of the People of God so that we may draw inspiration and guidance for our day-to-day life.

Therefore, I wish to dedicate this editorial on *Dei Verbum*, one of the four Constitutions of the Second Vatican Council. It is a Latin phrase, which when translated into English means the Word of God. It is the dogmatic Constitution on Divine Revelation promulgated by Pope Paul VI on November 18, 1965. It is one of the principal documents approved by the assembled bishops by a vote of 2344 out of 2500.

There are Four Constitutions promulgated by Vatican II, i.e., 1) Sacrosanctum Concilium - Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy, 2) Lumen Gentium - Dogmatic Constitution on the Church, 3) Dei Verbum- Dogmatic Constitution on Divine Revelation and Gaudium et spes - Pastoral Constitution on the Church in the Modern World. Besides, there are also other documents, i.e., three declarations and nine decrees. These Three Declarations are: 1) Gravissimum Educationis - Declaration on Christian Education; 2) Nostra Aetate -Declaration on the Relation on the Church to Non-Christian Religions and 3) Dignitatis Humanae - Declaration on Religious Freedom and the Nine Decrees, which are: 1) Inter Mirifica - Decree on Media of Social Communication, 2) Orientalium Ecclesiarum - Decree on the Catholic Churches of the Eastern Rite, 3) Unitatis Redintegratio - Decree on Ecumenism, 4) Christus Dominus - Decree on the Pastoral Office of Bishop in the Church, 5) Perfectae Caritatis - Decree on the Adaptation and Renewal of Religious Life, 6) Optatam Totius - Decree on Priestly Training, 7) Apostolicam Actuositatem - Decree on the Apostolate of the Laity, 8) Ad gentes - Decree on the Mission Activity of the Church and 9) Prebyterorum Ordinis - Decree on the Ministry and Life of Priests.

Dei Verbum is a beautiful document on Scripture in the history of Christianity. It is the teaching about the Bible by the Fathers of the Second Vatican Council. It has six chapters as follows 1) **Revelation**, 2) **Tradition**, 3) **Inspiration**, 4) The **Old Testament**, 5) The **New Testament** and 6) The **Use of Scripture in The Church**.

First Chapter is on Revelation which teaches us that God has revealed himself in many ways-through nature, historical acts, prophets,

Scripture, Tradition and at last Incarnation of Christ himself. The Council father assert, through divine revelation, God Chose to share with (men) those Divine treasures which totally transcend the understanding of the human mind".

Second Chapter teaches us about Tradition, i.e., God's revelation is handed down to us. The Council taught us clearly that Scripture and Tradition were two means by which the one Word of God is transmitted to us. Therefore, both Sacred Scripture and Sacred Tradition are to be accepted and venerated with the same sense of Loyalty and Reverence. The Bible is actually a part of Tradition because it is through the Tradition that we know the list of books included in the Bible and that these books are inspired Words of God.

Sacred Tradition includes all the aspects of liturgy, spirituality, theology and discipline of the Church expressed in the patristic writings, magisterial teachings, history of the Church, iconography, hagiography, living customs and practices of the Church.

Third Chapter teaches about the inspiration of Scripture. The Bible is truly God's Word, since God used men to compose everything and only those things which he wanted.

Fourth Chapter teaches us about the Old Testament. It is in carefully planning and preparing the salvation of the whole human race the God of infinite love by a special dispensation chose for himself a people to whom he would entrust the promises. He manifested Himself through words and deeds as the one true and living God. The plan of Salvation foretold by the sacred authors, recounted and explained by them is found as the true Word of God in the books of the Old Testament.

Fifth Chapter teaches that the Word of God, which is the power of God for the Salvation of all who believe (cf. Rom 1:16) is set forth and shows its power in a most excellent way in the writings of the New Testament. For when the fullness of time arrived (Gal 4:4) the word was made flesh and dwelt among us in His fullness of graces and truth (Jn 1:14).

Sixth and Last chapter teaches us on the role of scripture in the life of the Church. The Council reminds us that the Word of God is the soul of Sacred Liturgy which rests on the written Word of God. Sacred Synod earnestly urges all the Christian faithful to learn by frequent reading of the divine scriptures "excellent Knowledge of Jesus Christ (Phil 3:8). "For ignorance of the Scripture is the ignorance of Christ."

National Youth Sunday 2024: A Day of Inspiration and Growth



In adherence to the call of the Youth Commission of the Conference of Catholic Bishops of India, National Youth Sunday was meaningfully celebrated in the parishes of the Diocese on August 11, 2024. It was a day on which the contribution of the youth to the church was recognized and applauded. They were felicitated with gratuitous and encouraging words. Keeping before them the theme of this year; "Those who hope in the Lord walk without becoming weary!" (Isaiah 40:31), they organized community programmes, recreations and competitions to celebrate their youthfulness and fellowship.

In St. Stephen's Church, Kalyanpur, the event, which was an orientation for young people, attracted 60 participants. The day began with a prayer led by Fr. Rajen Singh, the Diocesan Youth Director. Fr. Himangshu Poti and Fr. John Britto welcomed the attendees and introduced the theme of the event. Fr. Rajen Singh emphasized the importance of hope and courage in transforming lives.

Fr. Tushar Augustine Gomes, Procurator of the Diocese, conducted a session on "Seven Habits of Highly Effective People" by Stephen R. Covey. He highlighted the significance of being proactive and reactive and emphasized the role of emotions in behavioural changes. He encouraged the youth to respond to situations with determination and to maintain mental and physical balance through meditation.

After lunch, Mr. Raj Bagh, the National Youth President of the Indian Catholic Youth Movement, conducted a session on activity-based learning. He shared his leadership experiences and emphasized the role of hope in creating new opportunities.

The day concluded with a Eucharistic Celebration offered by Fr. Rajen Singh and concelebrated by Fr. Tushar Augustine Gomes.

Seminar on the Protection of Children from Sexual Offences

On August 14, 2024, St. Paul's High School organized a seminar on the Protection of Children from Sexual Offences (POCSO) Act. The seminar featured two distinguished resource persons: Fr. Faustine Brank, an advocate, and Mr. Arindam Acharya, a former inspector of Police West Bengal. All the male and female staff members of St. Paul's High School attended the seminar.

Fr. Faustine Brank provided an insightful overview of various laws and acts, focusing on the legal framework and guiding the staff on how to act in accordance with the law. Mr. Arindam Acharya shared his experiences in combating human trafficking, recounting his past efforts in rescuing women and apprehending criminals responsible for such heinous crimes. He also shared about women harassment at workplaces. His stories of bravery and dedication deeply inspired the staff to pursue truth and justice in their own lives.



The seminar successfully raised awareness about the POCSO Act among the staff, ensuring they understood its implications and the importance of adherence to legal standards.
