# Sacramental Reconciliation and Forgiveness in the Year of Ordinary Jubilee 2025

In 2025, the Church celebrates the Year of Ordinary Jubilee, a time that calls all Catholics to renew their faith and grow spiritually. Though jubilees often include special events and celebrations, this year's focus highlights something foundational to our Christian lives: sacramental reconciliation and the power of forgiveness.

Reconciliation is not only an opportunity to say "sorry" for our mistakes; it's an invitation to restore our relationship with God and with others. The sacrament of reconciliation gives us the chance to heal, rebuild trust, and experience God's mercy in a real way. For Catholics, the confessional isn't just about guilt; it's about healing and renewal. It's where God invites us to return to Him, transforming our hearts and relationships.

### Reconciliation and the Call for Peace

The Year of Ordinary Jubilee invites us to deepen our understanding of reconciliation.

Reconciliation is about receiving forgiveness and sharing it with those around us.

Forgiveness is essential to healing. Holding onto anger only keeps us tied to past hurts. Though forgiving others can be difficult, it is necessary for peace. The Lord's Prayer reminds us that we ask God to forgive us as we forgive others - we cannot fully receive God's forgiveness if we are unwilling to forgive.

Forgiving others doesn't just free them, it frees us too. In this Jubilee year, we are called to reflect on our relationships and ask ourselves who we need to forgive. Forgiveness has the power to heal, restore peace, and transform our relationships.

# Practical Ways to Embrace Reconciliation in 2025

The Year of Ordinary Jubilee is a time to embrace reconciliation in practical ways. It's not just a spiritual goal but a concrete action in our daily lives. Here are several ways we can actively live out this call to reconciliation and forgiveness:

Going to Confession Regularly: The sacrament of reconciliation is a gift that we should use regularly. Let us make it a habit to visit the confessional at least once a month. Regular confession helps us stay spiritually healthy and aware of areas in our lives that need healing. It reminds us of God's endless mercy and gives us the grace to grow.

**Examine our Conscience:** Let us take time each day to reflect on our actions, thoughts, and feelings. What areas of our life need reconciliation? Are there people we need to forgive or ask forgiveness from? An honest examination of conscience is key to understanding where God's mercy is most needed in our hearts.

Forgive Others: Forgiveness is one of the hardest yet most rewarding things we can do. In the Year of Ordinary Jubilee, it is time to challenge ourselves to forgive. This may mean letting go of past hurts, mending broken relationships, or offering peace to someone who has wronged us. # Palli Unnayan Samiti Baruipur

PalliUnnayan Samiti Baruipur implemented several initiatives to enhance climate resilience and promote sustainable agriculture among marginal farmers.

#### Lime Powder Distribution and **Green Net Provision**

On February 04 & 05, 2025, 19,600 kg of lime powder was distributed among 700 marginal farmers in Namkhana and Patharpratima Blocks to combat soil salinity.



Additionally, 80 poor and marginalized betel vine farmers received green nets for repairing their betel vines.

#### **Exposure Visit and Demonstration**

On February 13 &14, 2025, 46 selected farmers from Namkhana and Patharpratima Blocks participated in an exposure visit to Ramkrishna Ashram Krishi Vigyan



Kendra, Nimpith. The two experts, Dr. Somnath Sardar and Dr. Tapas Sahana demonstrated climate-resilient agricultural practices, including vermin compost production, azola production and saline-tolerant crop cultivation.

### Workshop on DRR and **Climate Change Adoptive Agriculture**

On February 17&18, 2025, a workshop was conducted for 42 selected farmers from Basanti and Gosaba Blocks. Resource persons. Mr. Sukdeb Samanta



and Mr. Ashim Barman, discussed climate change impacts, adaptation methods and sustainable agriculture practices. Farmers learned about vermin compost production, saline-tolerant crop cultivation and economic resilience through off-farm activities.

These initiatives aim to promote climate resilience, sustainable agriculture and economic empowerment among marginal farmers in the Sundarbans region.
