The Empty Tomb of Christ

The early disciples witnessed the resurrection of Jesus Christ. They could not forget about the open tomb and His wounded hands and feet and pierced side. The living Christ had a powerful and profound effect on them. The people who went to the tomb on that first Easter morning testify to the power of the resurrection. They were in awe and wonder.

What do you think it would have been like to observe the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the grave? What if some listeners had understood when Jesus said that he would rise from the dead? What if he sought an opportunity to make this event a glorious show? What if he advertised in the newspapers and a huge crowd showed up to watch?

Many Churches try to depict this event during the night vigil with sound, light and music. A sense of wonder and ecstasy fills everyone watching. The feelings would never be forgotten.

The crucifixion of Jesus has left a vivid picture in the minds of the observers. It happened in an open place. There were so many witnesses to the suffering and death of Jesus. However, the event proper of resurrection of Jesus itself is never described anywhere in Scripture, presumably because no one saw Jesus exit the tomb. Not a single person beheld the moment when Jesus burst forth from the grave on that first Easter morning. No one witnessed the resurrection, but many have experienced it. No one can explain the resurrection, but many feel its effects. While the passion, death and crucifixion were public events, the resurrection was left to personal experience of life

The Bible teaches that Jesus was crucified on a Roman cross and then buried in a borrowed tomb. But, on the third day after his crucifixion, the women who had been followers went to his tomb and found it empty. They told the disciples, some of whom also went to the tomb and found it empty. And they left wondering what had happened to Jesus' body?

Why is the empty tomb significant in Christianity? Why is the empty tomb so central to the gospel narratives?

While the resurrection and the empty tomb are bound together, they are distinct. In the resurrection, Jesus demonstrated his mastery over

death and it holds promise for believers as well; that we also will have victory over death. But, unlike the resurrection, the empty tomb does not do anything for us. Instead, it tells us something. It tells us that the grave could not hold Jesus.

The empty tomb to the child of God means that sin's ability to keep us from God is empty, death's power to separate us from God is empty and anything in this world that could try and keep us from knowing the love of Christ in our lives is empty!

When we empty ourselves of things such as worry, anxiety, concern, frustrations and bitterness, all those things that come from our carnal flesh; there is more room for God inside of us. To be emptied of the things of this world and filled with the presence of God is a very important aspect of the Christian life.

The empty tomb provides us an opportunity to rejoice because now we know where to find Jesus. We need to redirect our search as the angel said, "Do not be afraid, for I know that you are looking for Jesus, who was crucified. He is not here; He has risen, just as he said."

There are many stones in life that keep us away from experiencing the empty tomb. These blocks disappear when we witness the resurrected Lord. When the disciples experienced him after resurrection, they became a new creation. Heavy stones were removed from their hearts to believe the resurrection and say that truly the tomb is empty.

Over the years, there have been many skeptics who have sought to explain away the empty tomb. Among them is Frank Morison, a skeptic who sought to write a rebuttal to the story of the resurrection. But during his research for the book, he became convinced that the tomb was empty. So instead he wrote, Who Moved the Stone in defense of the empty tomb.

So, in the end, why is the empty tomb important? It is primary important because it points to the bodily resurrection of Jesus. That death could not hold him. And, secondarily, because Jesus has risen, we can look forward to our own resurrection as well. The empty tomb demonstrates that death is not the end of the journey. There is much more to come.

Ring the Bell Activities - 2022

Palli Unnayan Samiti Baruipur conducted we Ring the Bell campaign in the following schools from 10th to 17th March 2022. The aim of "WE RING THE BELL" campaign is to make aware the school officials, community and the school children; specially the children with disabilities who ought to be enrolled in local school as per RTE act 2009.





"WE RING THE BELL" campaign is right based approach to make appropriate atmosphere accessible for children with disabilities; Enrolment and retention of children with disabilities in schools to ensure free compulsory education; Reduce the number of dropouts children with disabilities due to lack of accessible toilets, ramps and child friendly classrooms.

Altogether 1023 Children, Teachers and Guardians, PRI members and village leaders participated in we Ring the Bell Activities and brought awareness concerning the rights to education acts for the children with Disabilities.

School children encircle on their schoolyard and played the drums, blowing the whistles and raised huge voice together by ringing the bells, upholding posters and banners to get the attention of the school authority to have the enrolment of children with disability towards accessible infrastructures like Ramp and child friendly Toilets facilities and atmosphere in School for the Children with Disability.

Capacity Building Training on Children Parliament

Capacity Building Training on Children Parliament was conducted at PUS on 8th, 14th, 15th and 16th March 2022 under Protection of Adolescent Girls from Under Age Marriage program supported by Kindermissionswerk.

Altogether 120 selected adolescent boys and girls from Belegachi, Nikaryghata, Sarengabad and Dhosa area participated in these two phases of Training program. Mr. Pralay Bayen an expertise personality on children parliament facilitated the trainings as Resource Person.

Child Parliament is the platform open for learning opportunity to make them responsible for their growth towards child rights and social security. These capacity building training promote the quality of youth leadership among the neighborhood children in project operational area.

Each Child Parliament has its own Prime Minister and other cabinet ministers in charge of various issues like Health & Hygiene Promotion, Education, Climate Change Adaptation, Environmental Pollution, Juvenile Delinquency. The members of the children parliaments meet regularly and discuss their issues and problems such as Social issues, child right violation.



Nutritional Food Distribution to 175 Children in 5 Free Learning Centers
