Pope Francis: A Personal Encounter with a Servant Leader



Pope Francis is a special person in my life not just because he is the head of the Catholic Church, but because he changed my destiny. It was Pope Francis who appointed me first as the Coadjutor Bishop and later as the

Bishop of the Catholic Diocese of Baruipur. His decision led me on a path I never imagined, one that brought me closer to the heart of the Church and to the man who leads it with humility and grace.

My name was officially announced as Coadjutor Bishop on May 17, 2019. Soon after, I was asked to prepare quickly for my Episcopal ordination so that I could take part in the upcoming Ad Limina visit to Rome. This is a special visit where Bishops from around the world meet the Pope and present reports about their dioceses. I was part of the last group of bishops from India, and our visit was scheduled for September 18 to 27, 2019. By then, three other Indian groups had already completed their visits.

I was ordained a Bishop on June 24, 2019. Just a few months later, I found myself traveling to Rome. I felt like a dream. I never thought I would one day visit the very center of the Catholic world the Vatican.

In Rome, I stayed at the Domus Sanctae Marthae, the same guesthouse where Pope Francis lives. He stayed on the second floor, just above us. Each evening, we saw him from about 20 feet away, dining simply with others. He wore a plain white cassock and always had a kind smile. I once saw him putting food into the microwave an image that deeply touched me. It was hard to believe that the Pope, the leader of more than 1.4 billion Catholics, was so simple in

his daily life.

Sometimes we saw him coming out of the elevator. I was fortunate to exchanged greetings twice or thrice on such occasions. Once I saw him standing at the entrance of the hall where we Bishops had gathered. He welcomed each of us personally, shaking hands one by one. That moment standing face-to-face with Pope Francis was one of the greatest blessings of my life.

On the day of audience on September 26, 2019, he spent over an hour and a half speaking with us. He answered questions freely and kindly, like a father speaking to his children. One Bishop asked when he would come to India. The Pope replied that he was waiting for an invitation from the Indian government and was eager to visit. At the end of the meeting, he once again shook hands with each of us and gave us small rosaries as gifts.

To understand Pope Francis fully, it helps to know his story. He was born Jorge Mario Bergoglio in Buenos Aires, Argentina, in 1936. His parents were Italian immigrants, and he grew up in a working-class neighborhood. Before joining the seminary, he worked several jobs, including as a janitor and nightclub bouncer. These experiences gave him a deep understanding of everyday struggles.

Later, he joined the Society of Jesus the Jesuits who are known for their focus on education and service. As a Jesuit priest, he lived simply and served the poor. Even as Archbishop of Buenos Aires, he chose to live in a small apartment, cooked his own meals, and used public transportation. When he became Pope in 2013 the first from Latin America and the first Jesuit to do so he took the name "Francis," inspired by St. Francis of Assisi, who is known for his love of the poor and nature.

As pope, Francis has focused on three main messages: care for the poor, care for the mother

Earth and love for one another. He has written important letters to the Church, called encyclicals. In *Evangelii Gaudium* (The Joy of the Gospel), he encourages the Church to go out and meet people where they are, especially those who feel left out. In *Laudato Si'* (Praise Be to You), he speaks about climate change and says caring for the planet is a moral duty. In Fratelli Tutti (All Brothers), he calls for peace, friendship, and unity across all religions and nations.

Pope Francis led by example. On Holy Thursday, he washed the feet of prisoners, including women and non-Christians. He had opened parts of the Vatican to shelter the homeless. He regularly visited refugee camps and places affected by war. He reminded Bishops and Priests to stay close to their people and to serve with love.

What makes Pope Francis truly special is that he practiced what he preached. He chose not to live in the grand papal apartment, but in a modest guesthouse. He uses a small car. He had even foregone his due monthly honorarium of USD 32.000,00. He used to call the ordinary people who wrote to him. His famous words, "Who am I to judge?" show his gentle and inclusive approach to people who may feel rejected by the Church.

While some may find his ways different, many around the world see him as a light of hope. He brings the Church closer to the people and shows that faith is not about power, but about service. Even people who are not Catholic respect his leadership and values.

For me, Pope Francis is more than a global leader. He remains a model of a Good Shepherd to my people. Pope Francis teaches us that the greatest kind of leadership is found not in authority, but in love and humility. And that, I believe, is his greatest gift to the world.

Baruipur Diocese came together in a meaningful celebration of the Chrism Mass at St. Stephen's Church, Kalyanpur, on April 15, 2025. Presided over by Most Rev. The Chrism Mass was preceded by a spiritual preparation for clergy, featuring recollection, confession and adoration guided by Fr. George Panthanmackel, MSFS on the theme,



"Hope of Salvation amidst Challenges in Priestly Ministry." During the homily, Bishop emphasized the importance of embracing the three evangelical counsels of poverty, chastity and obedience as a way to live a life aligned with the Gospel. He also highlighted Pope Francis' words on the three temptations facing priests: compromise, surrogate

and discouragement. Following this, the clergy renewed their priestly promises, reaffirming their vows to serve Christ and the Church. The Bishop blessed the sacred oils of the Sick, Catechumens and the Sacred Chrism. At the conclusion of the Mass, two priests, Fr. Arup Bor and Fr. Sisir Khan, were honoured for their 25 years of dedicated service. A booklet on the "Synodal Process and Jubilee 2025" was also unveiled and handed over to Fr. Pradeep Roy, the eldest priest in the Diocese. The event's success was attributed to the efforts of Fr. Himangshu Poti, Fr. John Britto and the Parish Pastoral Council Members of the host parish, Kalyanpur.

The Passing Away of His Holiness Pope Franics

His Holiness Pope Francis, the 266th successor of St. Peter, the Apostle, was called by God to his Eternal abode on the Easter Monday, April 21, 2025. at 07:35 CEST at the age of 88 at Domus Sanctae Marthae in Vatican City. His death was



announced by Cardinal Kevin Farrell, the Camerlengo, in a broadcast by Vatican Media and in a video statement at 09:45 on the same day. He had served as Pope, the head of the Catholic Church, for twelve years since his election on March 13, 2013. He was the second pope to die in office in the 21st century, after John Paul II in 2005.

On receiving the news of the demise of Pope, Most Rev. Shyamal Bose officially informed all the priests, religious and laity asking to toll the church's bell, offer masses for the repose of his soul, observe nine days mourning and lowered flags during this period.

Following the announcement of The Holy See that Pope Francis' funeral to take place on Saturday April 26, 2025 at 10AM (1:30 pm IST) in St. Peter's Square, the priests, religious and faithful were directed by Most Rev. Shyamal Bose to close all the diocesan institutions to honour the life and legacy of the Supreme Pontiff. It was made obligatory for each parish to celebrate the Holy Eucharist at 7:00 AM or 6 PM or at another suitable time on the day of burial, offering prayers for the eternal repose of the soul of Pope Francis. In reverence and solidarity with the Universal Church the Bishop himself with the faithful offered the Mass in the Cathedral of the Immaculate Heart of Mary and St. Teresa of Calcutta, Baruipur.

Mr. Aloke (Montu) Mondal, the elder brother of Fr. Molloy Mondal and former Catechist of Jeliakhali under Kumrakhali Parish, passed away at the age of 79 on April 21, 2025. His funeral Mass was celebrated by Most Rev. Shyamal Bose on April 22, 2025, attended by priests, sisters, relatives and well-wishers, paying their final respects to a life of dedication and service. May his soul find eternal rest.

Sr. Fulgentia FC, a dedicated servant of God, passed away on April 27, 2025, at 10:00 AM, at the age of 86. With a lifetime of selfless service, she ministered in various capacities, notably in



Basanti and Gosaba within Baruipur Diocese. She was laid to rest on April 28, 2025. Her legacy of love, compassion and commitment will be remembered for years to come. May her soul rest in eternal peace.
