



Divine Mercy Devotion

The first Sunday after Easter has traditionally been known as "Low Sunday" since it follows the highest and greatest of all Sundays, to which all Sundays are "low" in comparison. However, on May 5, the Sunday after Easter of the Jubilee Year 2000, Pope John Paul II declared this Sunday as "Divine Mercy Sunday" and established the Feast of Mercy as requested by Our Lord through St. Faustina. Our Lord said to St. Faustina, "I desire that the first Sunday after Easter be the Feast of Mercy" (Diary 299). So this feast becomes the Easter gift that the Church receives from the Risen Christ and offers to humanity.

The placement of this feast has a high theological meaning. During the season of Lent and Holy Week, we contemplate the Passion and Death of our Lord, which was meant for reconciling the broken and sinful world to God. When Jesus just dies on the Cross on Good Friday, after a bitter passion, the novena preceding the feast of divine mercy begins with the intercession for poor and hardened sinners. Jesus said to Saint Faustina, "I desire trust from My creatures. Encourage souls to place great trust in My fathomless mercy. Let the weak, sinful soul have no fear to approach Me, for even if it had more sins than there are grains of sand in the world, all would be drowned in the unmeasurable depths of My mercy" (Diary 1059). We see how appropriate this Sunday is one week after

Holy Week with the image of Our Lord's Passion and Death for love of us still fresh in our minds, so that we would contemplate His great Mercy.

Faustina Kowalska, a Polish nun, reported visions and visitations from Jesus and conversations with him. He asked her to paint the vision of his merciful divinity being poured from his Sacred Heart and specifically asked for a feast of Divine Mercy to be established so that mankind would take refuge in him. Jesus said to St. Faustina, "I want the image solemnly blessed on the first Sunday after Easter, and I want it to be venerated publicly so that every soul may know about it" (Diary 341).

The message of Mercy is that God loves us, all of us, no matter how great our sins in the past have been. Our Lord wishes us to recognize that His Mercy is greater than our sins so that we call upon Him with trust, receive His Mercy and let it flow through us to others.

The message of mercy can be broken down into three parts that are as simple to remember as A, B and C.

'A' stands for 'Ask for His mercy'. We must first realize that God is merciful! He wishes us to ask for His Mercy upon ourselves, our nation and the whole world!

'B' stands for 'Be merciful to others'. He wants us to receive His Mercy and let it flow through us to others. He wants us to extend

love and forgiveness to others just as He does to us. Remember the beatitude, "Blessed are the Merciful for they shall obtain Mercy."

'C' stands for 'Confidence and Complete trust in God'. God wants us to trust in Him; to know and truly believe that He is God. He is in charge and is a loving God who is infinitely merciful. He does care for you! It is for this reason that on the image of Divine Mercy, Jesus had St. Faustina paint the words "Jesus I trust in Thee."

Jesus said to St. Faustina, "Souls who spread the honor of My mercy I shield through their entire lives as a tender mother her infant, and at the hour of death I will not be a Judge for them, but the Merciful Savior. At that last hour, a soul has nothing with which to defend itself except My mercy. Happy is the soul that during its lifetime immersed itself in the Fountain of Mercy, because justice will have no hold on it" (Diary 1075). St. Faustina is called 'The Apostle of Divine Mercy' as she took active part in spreading the devotion. Her life shows that she begged to be filled with this mercy in humility and truth, went out to be merciful to others everywhere and in all circumstances and took up sacrifices and mortifications to spread the message. May the Lord fill us with his grace to be the living witnesses and apostles of his great unfathomable mercy.

World Health Day Celebration



On 7th April 2022, Palli Unnayan Samiti Baruipur celebrated World Health Day in 9 Education Centers at Langalbaria, Gangadharpur, Bibirchak, Baruli, Kamlat, Talpukur, Bamangachi, Kochpukur and Radhaballavpur in Langalbaria Gram Panchayet of Sonarpur Block in the District of South 24 Parganas. The program began at 4:30 p.m. in all our Centers. Altogether 500 Children and their mothers, teachers and paramedical health worker participated in the World Health Day celebration 2022. The theme of



the world Health Day 2022 was **“Our Planet, Our Health”**

The teacher of the centres shared the objective of the Celebration of World Health Day to re-imagine a world where clean air, water and food are available to all, where economies are focused on health and well-being, where earth liveable and people have control over their health and also the health of the planet.

Mr. Gopal Chakladar, the local paramedical personnel offered free service to the people for testing Blood Pressure and test for level of Oxygen Saturation at Baruli Education Centre.

The diseases like cancer, asthma, heart disease increasing; our focus for attention to keep humans and the healthy planet focused on well-being on World Health Day 2022.

Nutritional Food, Educational Material, Toiletries Distribution in SAD Langalberia & Sundarban



On 6th April and 21st April 2022, Nutritional Food, Educational Materials and Toiletries distributed among the 28 student in St. Savio's Boys Hostel in Panchamkhanda and 416 Student of SAD Langalberia at Palli Unnayan Samiti Baruipur.

Each educational kit contained Exercise Books, Pens, Pencils, Drawing Exercise Books, Scale, Eraser, Pencil Cutter and Geometry Box for their educational workout and practice.

The Toiletries kits were content of bathing and washing Soaps, Tooth Pest & Brush and Shampoo



to maintain their personal Hygiene.

The food kits contained of Soybeans, Cooking oil, Pulses (Lentils), Sattu. Biscuits also were provided to the children to add nutritional diet for the prevention of their malnutrition.

Chicks Distribution at Sandeshkhali Block II

Cyclone “Amphan” and “Yaas” damaged the Livestock and poultry in the whole Coastal part of Sundarban. To promote the backyard poultry, 2500 chicks were distributed among 250 families belonging to marginal Farmers in 25 Gram Sansad under Sendeshkhali Block II in the District of North 24 Parganas on 11th April 2022.



The objective of the Chicks Distribution is to promote Backyard Poultry at their House, so that they could access the Eggs by their own and Surplus eggs can be sold out to add little earning for better survival.

DRR Campaigning at Jata Nagendrapur High School

Sundarban is declared as prone to Disaster like Flood and Cyclone; it is very common in the area; almost in every year. On 12th April 2022, Disaster Preparedness Campaign was conducted in Jata Nagendrapur High School.

The objective of the Campaign was to make aware the adolescent school children about the Disaster Preparedness in order to reduce the risk of the



Disaster. All together 80 student of Class X Participated in this Campaign.

Mr. Rajesh Shaw was the resource person to facilitate the program. He motivated the participant children for their role and responsibilities in Pre, During and Post disaster like Flood and Cyclone.

The Banner & Posters have been displayed and Leaflet also had been distributed among the children to bring further awareness in the neighbouring community about the Do & Don't during Cyclone, Flood and Thundering. The Campaigning was concluded with thanks and gratitude to all the teachers and children.

Training on Capacity Building of Teachers

On 25th April, 2022 a one-day Capacity Building Training for Teachers had been conducted in PUS HRDC Hall from 9:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. Altogether 36 Teachers from SAD Langalbaria and SAD Sundarban project participated in this Training Program. Mr. Ashim Campoo was the Resource Person of the day.

The program was inaugurated by Fr. Saumen Malik, the Director of PUS Baruipur at 9:30 a.m. After the inaugural address, the session was handovered to Mr. Campoo, the resource person of the Day. He discussed about the Quality of Teacher, Role and Responsibilities of the teachers and Teaching Methodology with power point presentation.

All the teachers actively participated in the session and enjoyed the lesson with Gap analysis, Group Discursion and Presentation. The Teachers are once more stimulated for the better teaching of the project children. The program was concluded with thanks and gratitude to all at 3:30 p.m.



Inauguration of Beautician Course



The Beautician Course inaugurated in three places namely Morapai under Mograhat I Block, Charavidya under Basanti Block and Beltali under Gosaba Block on 29th and 30th April, 2022 respectively. Fr. Saumen Malik the Director of Palli Unnayan Samiti Baruipur shared the objective of the course to promote earning opportunity among women to add some income to their family.

Altogether 128 adolescent girls and young women enrolled for this Beautician Training Course. The programme will continue for next three

months. The aim of the training course is to promote livelihood option among the rural women. The local PRI members and other dignitaries were present to grace the inaugural ceremony of the Beautician Course. All the participants who would successfully complete the course for next 3 months will be awarded with certificate.
