



The Two Pillars of the Church

On June 29, the Church celebrates the feast day of Sts. Peter & Paul. As early as the year 258, there is evidence of an already lengthy tradition of celebrating the solemnities of both Saint Peter and Saint Paul on the same day. Together, the two saints are the founders of the Holy See of Rome, through their preaching, ministry and martyrdom there.

In a sermon in the year 395, St. Augustine of Hippo said of Sts. Peter and Paul: "Both apostles share the same feast day, for these two were one; and even though they suffered on different days, they were as one. Peter went first, and Paul followed. And so we celebrate this day made holy for us by the Apostles' blood. Let us embrace what they believed, their life, their labours, their sufferings, their preaching, and their confession of faith."

Peter, called Simon, a fisherman of Galilee, was given the name Cephas (*Petrus* in Latin), which means 'Rock,' because he would become the rock upon which Christ would build His Church.

Peter was a bold follower of the Lord. He was the first to recognize that Jesus was "the Messiah, the Son of the Living God," and eagerly pledged his fidelity until death. In his boldness, he also made many mistakes, however, such as losing faith when walking on water with Christ and denying the Lord on the night of His passion.

Yet despite his human weaknesses, Peter was chosen to shepherd God's flock. The Acts of the Apostles illustrates his role as Head of the Church after the Resurrection and Ascension of our Lord. Peter led the Apostles as the first Pope and ensured that the

disciples kept the true faith.

St. Paul was the Apostle to the Gentiles. His letters are included in the writings of the New Testament, and through them we learn much about his life and the faith of the early Church.

Before receiving the name Paul, he was Saul, a Jewish Pharisee who zealously persecuted Christians in Jerusalem. Scripture records that Saul was present at the martyrdom of St. Stephen (AA7:57).

Both Peter and Paul are considered apostles, Peter because he was called by Jesus at the Sea of Galilee (Mt 4:18-20; Mk 1:16-18; Lk 5:10) and commissioned with the keys to the kingdom (Mt 16:19) and as the shepherd of the sheep (Jn 21:15-17); and Paul because he was called by Jesus on the road to Damascus (Acts 9:4-6) and commissioned "to be an apostle and set apart to proclaim the gospel" (Rom 1:1; AA 9:15). Peter is known as the "Prince of Apostles" while Paul is known as the "Apostle to the Gentiles."

The Book of the Acts of the Apostles (cf. 12:1-11) recounts the events of the imprisonment and subsequent *liberation* of Peter. He had previously experienced aversion to the Gospel in Jerusalem, where he had been imprisoned by King Herod, "intending ... to bring him out to make him suffer, before the people" (cf. v. 4). But he was miraculously saved and so was able to complete his evangelizing mission, firstly in the Holy Land and then in Rome, putting all of his energy at the service of the Christian Community.

Paul too experienced hostility from which he was *liberated* by the Lord. Sent out by the Risen One to many of the pagan cities, he

encountered strong resistance, both from his coreligionists and from the civil authorities. In writing to the disciple Timothy, he reflects on his life and on his own missionary journey, as well as on the persecution suffered for the sake of the Gospel.

These two "*liberations*" of Peter and Paul reveal the shared journey of the two Apostles, who were sent out by Jesus to proclaim the Gospel in difficult and in some cases hostile environments.

Through their personal and ecclesial experiences, they both demonstrate and tell us today that the Lord is always by our side; he walks with us; he never abandons us. Especially at the moment of trial, God reaches out his hand, comes to our aid and frees us from enemy threats.

Peter and Paul are the two pillars of the Church. One was an uneducated fisherman and the other hailed from the prestigious school of Gamaliel. Both needed the healing touch of love divine to dive into the work of proclamation, even at the cost of their lives. Their lives show the dynamism of the plan of God which can use us all with all our talents, education and even weaknesses. Their confession of faith in the Lord and conversion becomes the foundational experience for the Church and all its members. It calls us, irrespective of our state of life and vocation, to walk in the way of the Lord, heroically confessing our faith and living as daily martyrs. I wish you all a happy and grace filled feast of St. Peter and St. Paul. May the Lord bless you all through the intercession of these Saints.

Major activities of PUS Baruipur for the Month of May 2022

Capacity Building Training for PUS Office Staff

On 3rd to 5th May, 2022, a three-day training program was organized for the entire PUS project staffs for up-gradation of their Knowledge and Skill on Project Planning, Documentation, Monitoring & Evaluation towards further inputs for implementation of project activities. Altogether 60 staffs from different projects participated in this training program.

Mr. Basab Sarkar an expertise on NGO sector facilitated the training as Resource Person. The program was inaugurated by Fr. Saumen Malik, the Director of PUS Baruipur at 9:30 a.m. After the felicitation, Fr. Saumen Malik shared the objective of the training program and the session was handed over to Mr. Basab Sarkar.

Mr. Sarkar shared the problem and objective Tree Analysis for project planning, Base and End line survey, Field Visits, Result Based Management, Logical Framework, Details of Implementation Plan, Monitoring & Evaluation tools, Report Writing, Case Study, FGD (Focused Group Discussion), Leadership & Teamwork, Role and Responsibilities of Social Mobilizers, Social Educators and Teamwork.

The staffs were once again refreshed with the updated knowledge and skills which could be used for the project planning and documentation of activities.

Inauguration of CEI Livelihood Project

On 5th May 2022, Rt. Rev. Bishop Shyamal Bose, the Bishop of Catholic Diocese of Baruipur was invited as Guest of Honor for the Inauguration of "Sustainable Agriculture Based Livelihood for most disadvantaged Small holder farmers in Coastal area of Disaster prone Sundarban" project. The project is supported by Conferenza Episcopale Italiana, Italy.



The Project has been launched for three years from April 2022 March 2024. The operational areas covered under the project are 30 coastal villages in Namkhana and Patharpratima Block in the District of South 24 Parganas. Fr. Saumen Malik, the director of PUS Baruipur shared the brief introduction of the project.



Rt. Rev. Bishop Shyamal Bose blessed the New Motor Cycle for another project namely *Free Learning Center*, which has been started in the month of January 2022, supported by Kindermissionswerk, Germany.

It was also our Great Pleasure to Celebrate the 32 years of Priestly Ordination of Rt. Rev. Shyamal Bose during the Inaugural ceremony.

CEI Project Staff Orientation 19th & 20th May, 2022

The staff orientation training of “Sustainable Agriculture-based Livelihood for the most disadvantage small holder farmers in the coastal area of disaster prone Sundarban” has been conducted on 19th & 20th of May, 2022.

Altogether 7 selected staffs under the project participated in this orientation program for capacity building for the smooth implementation of the project activities. Mr. Sanjib Mandal, facilitated the training program as Resource Person. He shared the goal, objective and the activities of the project and also roles & responsibilities of a Social Mobilizer and Educator.

Inauguration of Beautician Course – Supported by Kindermissionswerk, Germany

The Beautician Course was inaugurated in four places, namely Dhosa, Belegachi, Nikaryghata and Sarengabad GP in project operational area on 13th and 16th May, 2022 respectively.

Fr. Saumen Malik, the Director and Sr. Victoria, the Asst. Director of Palli Unnayan Samiti Baruipur, shared the objective of the course to promote earning opportunity among women to add some income to their family.

Altogether 145 adolescent girls and young women enrolled for this Beautician Training Course at 4 Centers. The programme will continue for next three months. The local PRI members and other dignitaries were present to grace the inaugural ceremony of the Beautician Course. All the participants who could successfully complete the course for next 3 months, they will be awarded with certificate.

Capacity Building Training on Children Parliament

The Capacity Building Training on Children Parliament was conducted at PUS on 30th & 31st May, 2022, under Women and Child Protection against Abuse and Violence Project supported by Misereor.

The training session started with the lighting of the lamp at 10:30 am. Fr. Saumen Malik, the Director of PUS shared the Object of the Program. Altogether 30 selected adolescent boys and girls from Shambhunagar, Pathankhali, Fulmalancha, Choravidya, Amjhara in Gosaba and Basanti Block participated in this Capacity Building Training Program.

Child Parliament is the platform open for learning opportunity to make them accountable for their growth towards protection of child from abuse & Violence and social security.

Mr. Pralay Bayen and Mr. Sanjib Mandal, the expert personalities on children parliament and youth Leadership facilitated the training as Resource Person.

Each Child Parliament has its own Prime Minister and other cabinet ministers in charge of various issues like Health & Hygiene Promotion, Education, Sports and culture, Climate Change Adaptation, Environmental Pollution, and Juvenile Delinquency. These capacity building training promote the quality of youth leadership among the children belonging to Rural Community in project operational area. The members of the children parliaments meet regularly and discuss their issues and problems such as Social issues, child right violation etc.



Pastoral Visitation and Confirmation at Sajnaberia

Bishop came to Sajnaberia parish for a pastoral visit from May 6th to 8th, 2022. On the first two days he met all the Pious groups and visited several houses.
